Opening Discussion - Although Jesus was a single man, How would you describe Jesus' view children?

Session One - The Lord Jesus is your all-sufficient shepherd in commissioning you as His ambassador to your children so that you will faithfully fulfill your parental ministry for Christ's glory

1A. Your identity as Christian parent

2A. The identity of your children – Same texts in Genesis

- Created in God's Image "Little People" (cf Psalm 139:13-16)
- A gift from God Psalm 127
- Fallen Sinners Psalm 51:5, Proverbs 22:15
- Redeemable Christ can save, regenerate, and mature
- 3A. Your resources Christ has provided to you as His Parent-Ambassador? (cf 2 Peter 1:3) Abundant Reason for parental HOPE! How big is Your God?
 - An all sufficient Savior John 10:10, Romans 8:31-32, 2 Corinthians 12:7-10
 - An all sufficient Helper, Counselor & Guide John 14:25-27, 16:12-15, Galatians 3:1-3
 - An all sufficient Word 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Galatians 3:24 (cf Matthew 7:24-27)
 - A redemptive community the local church (One anothers, Wise Counselors, Undershepherds)
- An ever present avenue to obtain ALL the HELP we need Psalm 121, Philippians 4:6-7 **PRAY** Illustration Mark 9:14-24 Father of demon possessed son "Help my Unbelief" Christ alone helped him!

Session Two – As Christ's commissioned ambassador to my children I'm called to adopt and pursue the goals Christ has established for me and my children

How have you seen Christians unwittingly influenced in the goals they adopt for their children?

4A. What is the cultural context in which we are raising our children? What lies are evangelistically proclaimed as the right way to raise your kids?

Outside the church? (Don't be deceived, naïve or ignorant of the schemes of the devil and this world)

- Colossians 2:4,8, 1 John 5:19, Romans 12:2 (cf 2 Corinthians 10:3-5)
- Ephesians 6:10-13 Reality of Spiritual Warfare
- 1 John 2:15-16 the world promises happiness it cannot deliver

Inside the church? (Romans 7:14-25 Understand your remaining sin and each member of your family)

- Selfishness
- Laziness & Inattentiveness
- Wrong Thinking that Leads to Errant Counsel (e.g. Experience Based)
 - o Versions of "Formula Parenting"
 - Imbalanced Over-Reactionary Movements of Familiolatry
- Unbelief, Discouragement & Despair
- One Another sin against each other. Christ's forgiveness and relational forgiveness

 - 3B. Invest Relationally in Your Children Climate of Affection, Warmth, Closeness & Encouragement 1 John 3:18, 1 Corinthians 13:4-7
 - 4B. Minister to Your Children Serve as unto The Lord
 - 5B. Condition Their Conscience Acts 24:16
 - 6B. Maximize the Means of Grace
 - 1C. False caricatures of legalism 1 Corinthians 9:24-27

- 6A. Your Responsibilities as a parent ambassador of Christ (Ephesians 6:4 Rest of this ATS Class)
 - 1B. The Role Fathers
 - 2B. Negatively "Do not provoke your children to anger"
 - 3B. Positively "But bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord"

Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Why or Why not?

"It is a sad reality that many children leaving Christian homes do not have a heart for God. They may profess to be Christians, and they are surely no philosophical atheists, but they are worldly in the way they approach life. There is little evidence in their day-by-day living of a hunger for God. These children do not consciously deny God, but other things have replaced His functional rulership in their lives. Love of God has been replaced by love of other things. Even though they are not overtly rebellious, at the heart level there is a greater love for the "world" than there is for the "Father" (1 John 2:15). They have worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator (Romans 1:25)" pp 170-171, Paul Tripp "Age of Opportunity"
