Christian Liberty Definition

Areas of life not explicitly addressed in Scripture where the Christian is free to make up his own mind as to whether he will participate or abstain (Romans 14:5)

2) The Galatian Lesson - "Stand Firm" (Galatians 5)

Legalists

3) The Roman Lesson – "Judge Not" "Receive" (Romans 14-15)
