- I. The unruly tongue: James 3:1-12
 - A. James wisely teaches that we have communication problems.
 - 1. The tongue causes consequences v1-2
 - 2. The tongue is offensive v2
 - 3. The challenge to control the tongue: It possesses great power and influence both for good and evil v3-5a
 - 4. The tongue is a fire v5b-6
 - 5. The tongue CAN NOT be tamed v7-8
 - 6. The tongue is like a broken fountain a fountain is a source that pumps out or jets out a substance v9-12
- II. The heart of the problem: Mt.15:18-20
 - A. Jesus explains why we have a tongue problem:
 - 1. Man's communication problem starts with his heart v18
 - 2. Jesus teaches the heart is a broken fountain v19-20
- III. Keys to control the tongue: Ps.19:1-14
 - A. A Relationship with God: David fixates on his highest prize, The Lord, his Rock and Redeemer:
 - 1. A face to face relationship with his Redeemer: David is committed to live face to face with his Redeemer v14
 - 2. A face to face relationship with his Creator: David bonds with the LORD through His Natural Revelation v1-6 (Col.1:16, Heb.1:1-3)
 - 3. A face to face Relationship with the Word: David is fixated on God through His Divine Revelation v7-11 (Joh.1:1-3, 14)
 - 4. A face to face relationship with the LORD of all Grace: David is fixated on the Redeemer by Grace v12-14
